Parenting Corner

With school starting, many kids get a little apprehensive about being on their own at school. They worry that no one will like them or want to be a working partner with them in class. There are a number of things that you can do to help quash the fears of your youngsters as school starts:

1. **Remind your child it's the first day of school for everyone.** Everyone has jitters on the first day and during the first week or so of school. Let your child know that everyone in the class is going to have the same fears as your child. Everyone is worried he/she won't have friends or that he/she will be the last one picked as a partner.
2. **Encourage him/her to be himself/herself.** While everyone wants to fit in, it is important that your child knows the best way to make friends is to be himself/herself. Let him/her know that it is okay to pick up a new "like," but he/she does not want to go out and buy everything that their new friend has.
3. **Teach him/her the importance of a smile.** Chances are pretty good that on the first day of school there are other shy kids that are afraid to be the first to talk to anyone. So tell your child if there is another child that he/she wants to talk to he/she should smile at him/her and say hello. It is amazing to note the impact of a simple smile and the small phrase, "Hi."
4. **Ask about your child's day.** Be excited about his/her school day. Ask how his/her day was and then listen actively to what he/she tells you. Show him/her that you are interested in what happened at school so he/she knows that you are really excited about what excited him/her.
